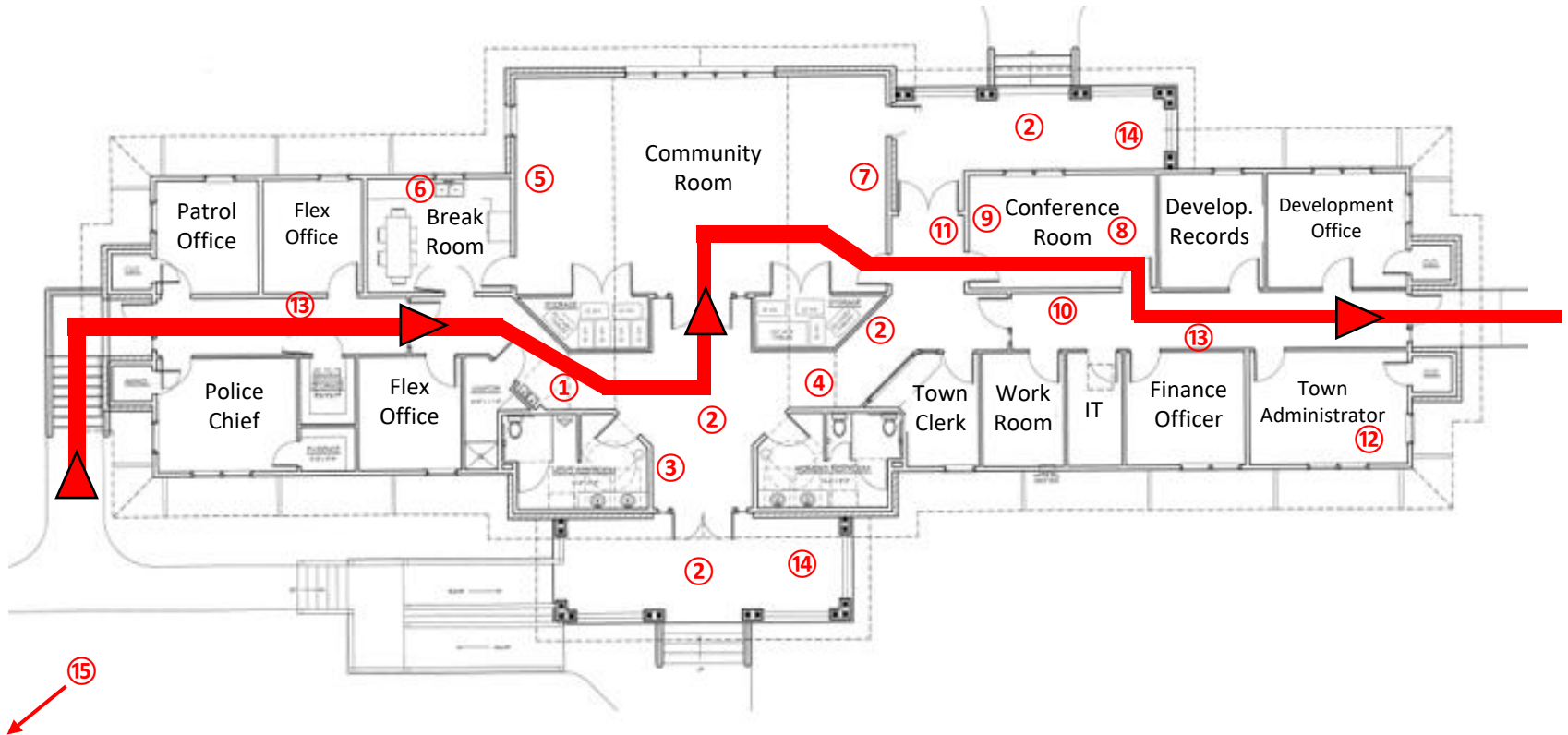


# Welcome to the new Montreat Town Hall
